## RABBI'S MESSAGE

### We're Going to Israel, October 19-31, 2022!

Temple B'nai Tikvah is going to Israel! As I mentioned on Rosh Hashanah, and as you may have seen in recent publicity, next fall our congregation will be taking a memorable trip to see the sights and meet the people of that country, hallowed by ancient hopes and modern dreams.

With the help of Jeff Faber and Peter Driftmier, and under the guidance of Rabbi Don Goor (who served our congregation as a student-rabbi back in the 1980s), we are planning a wonderful trip, and I hope you'll join us. We'll tour Jerusalem, we'll walk the beaches and boulevards of Tel Aviv, we'll meet people and organizations working to

ensure peace and human rights in that troubled part of the world. We'll also celebrate Shabbat with an Israeli Reform congregation, venture into safe areas of the occupied territories, and get a behind-the-headlines look at what is happening in Israel today. Israel is one of the oldest and one of the newest countries in the world, and, while our visit will be brief, it promises to give us a taste of this most fascinating and beloved place for our people.

And during our visit, of course, we will forge and deepen friendships with fellow Temple members. It will be the experience of a lifetime – one that is definitely not to be missed.

Some of us who are interested in going have already met, but it's not too late to get on board. If you are interested, please contact me at your convenience, and I can get you the details.

On our trip, Israel will come alive, becoming more than what you see in the news, more than what gets debated by pundits, more than what you read in the books. You will see Israel in all its glory – as the fascinating, troubled, beautiful, exciting, infuriating, vibrant country that it really is.

Please come! It will be the experience of a lifetime for us all, and I'd love to have you be part of it.

### Israel: Working on The Puzzle book group

TBT is starting a new book club, **Israel: Working on the Puzzle**, with the purpose of increasing understanding of the complexities of Israeli society and of the Israel-Palestine conflict. The guiding principle of this club aligns with the Reform movement support for Israel, coupled with a desire to make it the best it can be.

The book club will explore the work of writers of both fiction and non-fiction, who have nuanced views on Israel and bring us insights which will deepen our understanding.

The first book is **Catch 67: The Left, The Right and the Legacy of the Six Day War** by Micah Goodman, with discussion facilitated by Judy Shapiro. Goodman deftly sheds light on the ideas that have shaped Israelis' thinking on both sides of the debate on whether to keep the land conquered in 1967 or to return some, if not all, of the territories to Palestinians.

From herding sheep to plowing soil, learning to spin wool and collecting eggs from the chickens to make challah each Shabbat, Sydney will share highlights from her experience and why it was a very Jewish experience.

Originally from Calgary, Sydney Switzer has spent the past 10 years in Jerusalem, Vancouver, Mumbai, and now Glasgow, where she serves as the Scotland Senior Educator for UJIA. 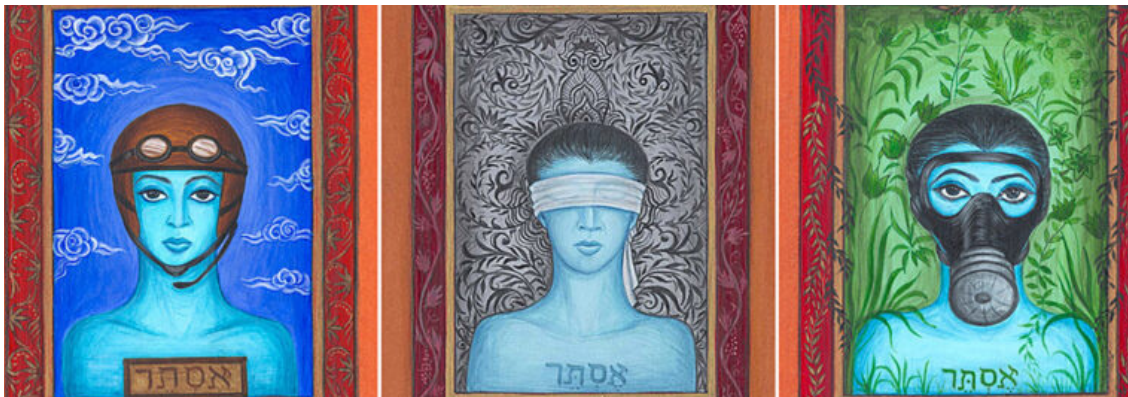

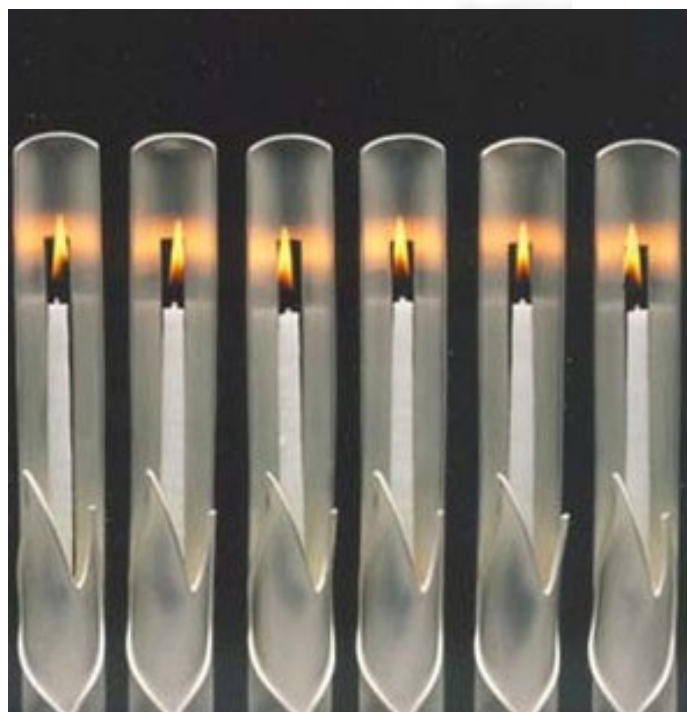
