## RABBI'S MESSAGE – Strong Hands and Outstretched Arms: Vaccination as a Road to Redemption

The literature of our people is packed full of images of redemption. The Red Sea is the most famous—its walls of water representing God's intervention in Israelite history on behalf of our people. The dream of the messiah is another—the lion existing peaceably with the lamb, each of us sitting beneath vine and fig with none to make us afraid.

But there's another redemption image in Torah that is particularly timely for us today. It appears in

the Passover Haggadah, and several times in the Torah. There we read that God redeemed our people—and soon, we hope, redeem the world “with a strong hand and an outstretched arm.”

Strength and outreach—these acts have saved our people, and will one day save the world.

Divine strength shows itself in many ways, and throughout our past, we Jews have often seen human deeds which help other people as among its most magnificent manifestations. When we figure out how to make life better for ourselves and for others, we allow God's strength to be seen in the world.

One recent example of this is the lightning-quick development in recent months of COVID-19 vaccines. As you know, such inoculations used to take many years to develop, but the hard work of scientists facing the recent pandemic has resulted in very speedy results. Now, there is a way for us to avoid the horrible illness and death that has been

the scourge of this nasty disease. God's strength—as expressed by the heroic work of these scientists—is truly impressive.

Of course, God's strength alone isn't enough to bring an end to the suffering that has resulted from this pandemic. We also need an outstretched arm. And here is where each of us comes in. It's up to each of us to make appointments for our vaccinations, show up to those appointments, and reach our arms out for the injections. We owe it to ourselves, and we owe it to one another to put an end to this disease.

Getting vaccinated isn't only a good thing to do; it's a sacred obligation that falls upon each of us.

So please, if you haven't yet done so, get your shots as soon as you can. I've received my shots, and I hope you get yours, too. God's strength has made this inoculation possible; our outstretched arms can make it happen. Only when we all do our part can we get through these dark days and build a better world for us all.

## Environment Committee seeks volunteers to help save the planet

Environment Committee members focus on reducing Temple's environment impact. Among other interesting opportunities, we have a role for volunteer gardeners and grant writers.

Our inaugural speaker, Dr. Tanhum Yoreh, presented a Jewish history against wastefulness. For the link to the recording of his excellent talk, contact the office. Our other activities include:

1. A waste audit that reviews what comes in and how it is used before it goes out. Although we can't enter the building, we are studying the Temple's energy and water bills and waste production for ways to reduce.
2. With the ad hoc Building Committee, we're investigating building retrofits and energy-efficiency upgrades, and grants for funding these.
3. As conferences moved online, we are virtually accessing Jewish resources to combat climate change. We created a google drive library for all to access and share. With this accumulating knowledge, we are able to recommend to the Board policies, procedures and programs for environmental justice.

## CALGARY ALLIANCE for the COMMON GOOD (CACG)

Temple members continue to play an active role in supporting the CACG. Last month, two of their initiatives were implemented.

The Calgary Police Service and AHS have agreed to expand the [Police and Crisis Team \(PACT\)](#) and [Mobile Response Team \(MRT\)](#).

The PACT teams consist of a mental health professional and a specially trained police officer. The Mobile Response Teams are made up of mental health professionals. These teams respond to emergencies when having only a police officer simply does not make sense. They allow for the right person, with the right training to respond at the right time which is of benefit to everyone including the individual in crisis, their family, the police and our broader community.

- Calgary Police Services, with the City of Calgary, added funding to increase the number of PACT teams to 6. Their hours of operation will also increase.
- Calgary Police Services and the City of Calgary have provided funding to expand the hours for the Mobile Response Team consult lines. MRT will now be available for phone consults 24 hours/day, year round. They can be used by police officers to access professionals and via the Distress Centre for families and individuals.



## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This has been a month of big events, and I wanted to share a few of them with you.

**On May 11** we adopted our revised Constitution. This was the product of several years' worth of work starting after our AGM in 2017 by the Constitution Review Committee: Norm Yanofsky (Chair), Terry Bell, Julia Cornester, Betsy Jameson, Eric Men, Rick Phillips, and Rabbi Glickman (ex officio). I'd like to thank each of these members sincerely for all of their work and dedication in making careful, considered recommendations and in walking the entire congregation through several year's worth of questions.

**On May 10**, we began watching in shock and concern as rockets fired from Gaza began to rain on Israel. My heart goes out to all those who have been touched by tragedy as a result of this conflict, and stand with all those who wish to bring the violence and hatred to a swift close and lasting peace.

At our most recent Board meeting, we endorsed a statement from the Reform Jewish Communities of Canada, ARZA Canada, and Reform Rabbis of Canada. You can read it [here](#).

**In April**, we received a final report from a Building Condition Assessment process we started in November. It indicates that our building has a lot of life left in it, though it will need regular maintenance and capital upgrades over the next 25 years. To respond to the needs outlined in the report, we are putting together a committee to help organize our resources to make sure we keep our building healthy, modern and ready to keep hosting services for years to come. First up, in the next year or so, will be a replacement of our boiler and heating systems. If you are interested in being a part of a revived Building Committee, or have experience with HVAC systems, please give me a shout.

**Through late April and into May**, the Province of Alberta began rolling out COVID-19 immunizations to younger populations. At the time I'm writing this, I've had one vaccine myself, and am eagerly anticipating the immunization of my two children next week. These vaccinations have, so far, proven highly effective at preventing the more dangerous and deadly outcomes of the virus we've been living with for over a year now. If you haven't received a shot yet, and are able to, please do. Getting through this pandemic is the fastest way we can get back into our sanctuary for in-person services... not to mention out for a lunch, a coffee, or a visit with our friends and loved ones.

**On May 8**, our Shabbat School wrapped up the 2020/2021 year. This has been a very unusual year for most young people, and our students were no exception. I want to thank our Shabbat School staff, teachers, and leadership for being incredibly responsive, helpful, and caring for the education of our young people despite repeated openings and closings, changing health guidance, and the unique needs of our students.

**On May 10**, our Office Manager Lana Niemi returned from maternity leave. We are very happy to have her back, and thank Patricia Martin for her incredible work over the past year. Those of us who had the pleasure of working with Patricia will certainly miss her, and look forward to any opportunity to see her again.

**On May 26**, we held our last regular Board meeting for the year. I'd like to thank every Board member for their contributions in this difficult year, with special gratitude to those who will not be returning to the Board next year.

**Last Friday afternoon**, the weather was nice enough that I was able to emerge, rather pasty and red-eyed, from my basement office for a walk around the neighbourhood. Birds were chirping, buds were on branches, flowers were opening for visits by bumblebees, and the sun was warm on my face. I remembered that our services continue and our classes are filling. We have excellent clergy helping our spiritual growth, as well as hardworking staff and dedicated volunteers making sure we have access to the services we need. We've had a Board of Trustees I've been proud to serve with this year, and I'm looking forward to getting more good work done next year. Vaccinations are happening, the sky is blue, and there's every reason to believe we have good days ahead.

### Message from the Social Committee

The Social Committee is hoping to organize a welcome back event at the Temple but timing is dependent on Alberta's reopening plans. Stay tuned for further announcements.

## LIFE & LEGACY: It's time for some reflection

As I write this in mid-May, many things are happening that specifically relate to the sustainability of Judaism. First and foremost, Israel is under attack and we pray for an early ceasefire and relief of suffering. Compared to that situation, the other events seem pale, yet they are truly important.

The Calgary Jewish Community has finished the first half of the four-year LIFE & LEGACY program and all participating synagogues and agencies have achieved all our goals. This means that for the first time in the history of Jewish Calgary, an endowment fund has been built that will guarantee some financial stability and sustainability for the future. Importantly, we have begun to create a culture of giving which will result in long-term benefits for sustaining Jewish life in Calgary. At Temple, it is clear that our Temple Legacy Circle will continue to grow and grow as more of our members begin to think of updating their wills and including charitable donations to the endowment fund held by the Jewish Community Foundation of Calgary.

How have we done all that? *With your help.* There are now more than 50 Temple families who have said 'yes, I plan to allocate some funds for the future of our Jewish community.' We are now 1/6 of the Temple congregation. City-wide, LIFE & LEGACY has attracted 544 Letters of Intent, with a future endowment when realized of \$17.3 million (estimated, of course).

To those 51 individuals and families in the Temple Legacy Circle, Kol HaKavod. And to the rest of our Temple family we ask this: Can you spare 30 minutes this summer to talk to one of us about this program? During these difficult days in Israel, now is a great time to be thinking about how to secure Judaism's future.


